Dear American Service Veterans and Friends:

Friday, September 16 - LOS ANGELES/ALOFT.

Leave Los Angeles International Airport via Korean Air Lines DC-10 or 747 jet to Seoul via Honolulu.

Saturday, September 17 - EN ROUTE. Cross International Date Line and lose a day.

Sunday, September 18 - SEOUL.

Arrive Seoul early this morning for official welcome at Kimpo Airport by Korean Veterans Association and other officials. Transfer to your hotel. Balance of day to rest and 'settle in'. Dinner provided.

Monday, September 19 - SEOUL.

Morning at leisure. Afternoon visit to the National Cemetery for official ceremonies at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and signing of the 'Book of Honor', then continue on an orientation tour of Seoul via the impressive Skyway and Namsan where panoramic views of the city will fascinate you. Visit will be made at Kyongbok Palace to see the National Museum as well. Tonight - an official government reception followed by dinner hosted by the Chairman of the Korean Veterans Association and the President of Korean National Tourism Corporation.

Tuesday, September 20 - SEOUL.

Full day excursion to Panmunjom via Munsan and the Imjin River with lunch provided. Here the Armistice Agreement was signed in 1953 in a narrow demilitarized zone, and it is still the site of regular meetings between the North Koreans and United Nations Command. On a return a stop will be made at the new memorial built by Korea to honor the United States for brief ceremony and to place a wreath. Dinner under own arrangements.

Wednesday, September 21 - SEOUL.

A free day to enjoy more of Seoul on your own - to shop, relax, or if you wish, independent arrangements will be made for you to visit other nearby areas (Inchon, Task Force Smith Monument, etc.). Lunch and dinner under own arrangements to enable you to enjoy some of Korea's superb restaurants.

Thursday, September 22 - SEOUL.

Morning at leisure. Afternoon tour to Korean Folk Village for an authentic glimpse of Korea's past - their customs, culture and crafts. Tonight - you will be the guest of the Korean National Tourism Corporation for dinner and exotic show at famous Walker Hill Resort Night Club.

Friday, September 23 - SEOUL/HONOLULU/LOS ANGELES.

The day is free until time to transfer to the airport for the return flight to Los Angeles via Korean Air Lines jetliner. Cross the International Date Line and pick up the day lost on your westbound flight. Arrive Honolulu early this morning (same day), clear U.S. Customs and Passport Control, then continue via Korean Air Lines to Los Angeles, arriving early in the evening.
